

ARJ PRESENTS: Brown v. Board of Education National Historic Park Tour Saturday, November 5

ARJ is finalizing the arrangements for a bus that will take us to Topeka for an amazing learning experience. Established in Topeka in 1992 by the United States Congress, this museum site commemorates the Supreme Court landmark decision aimed at ending racial segregation in public schools. The Brown v Board of Education case was consolidated with four other cases on school segregation. The museum's inclusion of the history of all five cases shows a broader story of education racism and the legal fight against it. 






"SOUND & STORY" 25 YEARS AT THE AMERICAN JAZZ MUSEUM


