

## Resurrection

### Online and TV

Resurrection began offering online worship services in 2008 in hopes of connecting with those who were unable or unwilling to attend in-person. Online attendance grew steadily to 4,500 people weekly by 2020. In response to the pandemic, Resurrection began expanding our online presence. Currently, about 8,000 people join us in worship online and nearly 17,000 join us in worship on TV each week. In addition to weekly worship, we offer online classes, small groups, support groups and pastoral care.

We believe Resurrection offers an approach to the gospel that people need. If we invest in new expansions of our online and TV ministry, we know we can connect with new people who aren't yet actively growing in their faith. Resurrection has always been a church that welcomes non-religious and nominally religious people and our online and TV services are effective at reaching those who might not otherwise set foot in a church. Each week we reach people from all over the world including people who are interested in Jesus but have been either turned off or pushed away by religion. Online and broadcast ministry is here to stay and we feel compelled to expand our ministry so that all generations, and those who are not yet part of a church will find Christian community at Resurrection.

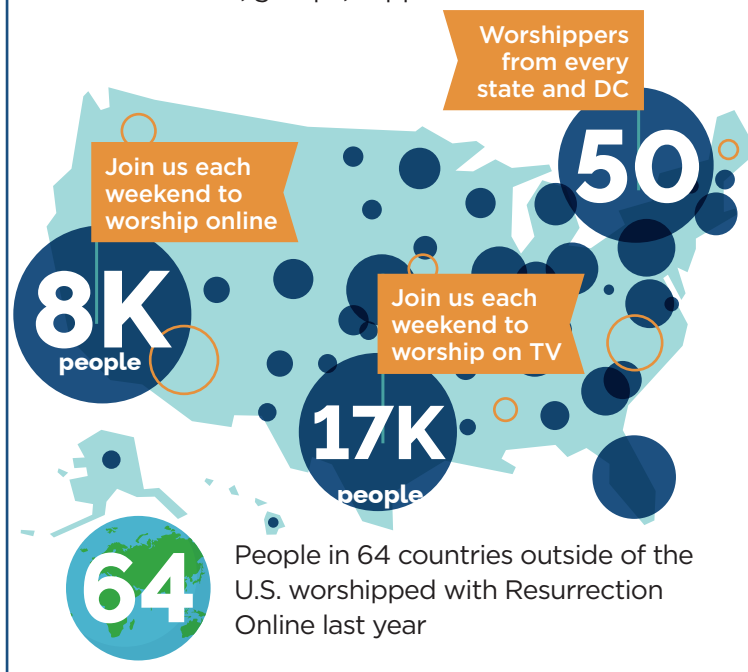
