

NATIONAL BAIL OUT

The National Bail Out collective came together in recognition of the devastating harm and disproportionate impact that money bail and pretrial detention have on communities of Black people. The organization is committed to freeing our people through bail outs, advocacy, and leadership development.

Every day, tens of thousands of people languish in jail simply because they cannot afford bail. In addition to the \$25 billion+ wasted on

incarcerating people convicted of no crime, pretrial incarceration has catastrophic impacts on families and communities. Black people are incarcerated at nearly five times the rate of white people and, once arrested, are twice as likely to be “caged” before trial. LGBTQ and gender-nonconforming families are targeted at even more alarming rates, and once in jail, they are significantly more likely to be sexually and physically abused.

Even a few days in jail can ruin a person’s life. They may lose their job, their family housing, and their children ... even if they’re later found innocent of the crime they were charged with.

The majority of the female prison population are women of color and low-income women. According to a report by the Vera Institute of Justice, nearly two-thirds of women in jail are women of color; 44% are Black, 36% are white, 15% are Latinx, and 5% are of other backgrounds. The report indicates that most incarcerated women are in jail for low-level offenses, which can include things such as loitering or simple drug possession. Their bails could vary from \$75 to \$30,000.

The week before Mother’s Day, organizations in dozens of cities across the country will bail out as many mothers as possible who otherwise would spend Mother’s Day in a cell simply because they cannot afford bail. For more information and to find out how you can help, [CLICK HERE](#).
